- Modernist experimentation from an interdisciplinary perspective.
- The relationship between literature and the visual arts.
- Metamorphoses of Dance in Early Twentieth Century World Literature.
- Modern and contemporary representations of ancient cultures, with particular attention to the Etruscans.
- The influence of traditional Japanese culture on European Modernism, with particular attention to Noh and Kabuki theatre.
- D. H. Lawrence: travel writings, Lawrence and Italy, Lawrence and ancient Italian cultures, fiction, non-fiction writings, Lawrence's paintings.
- British and American Poetry, from 1950s onwards.
- Contemporary Anglo-American Poetry in an interdisciplinary perspective (poetry and music, poetry and sexuality, poetry and photography).
- The Anglo-American Poet Thom Gunn.
- Representations of ageing in contemporary American poetry.
- Translation Studies.

It will be done through the linguistic center of foreign languages, and it will be accessible to students of all scientific and cultural areas.
